### Alan George Griffin

(1941-2025)

Alan grew up in Southam, one of three sons of a baker living at Southam Windmill. He attended Leamington College until aged 16 and was then apprenticed to a Leamington engineer. He 'moonlighted' at weekends as a sports journalist and

photographer, riding pillion on a motorbike to catch the latest scores and phoning them in for 'The Pink' publication.

Photography was always his passion. He dedicated 28 years to the Fire Service and published articles and *Fetch the Engines*. In 'retirement,' Alan was a County Record Office Archives Assistant, a Court Usher, Security at Warwick Castle, a volunteer at St Mary's Church, Warwick, and for many years a volunteer at St Paul's Cathedral. He enjoyed his role as Father Christmas at Burgis and Colbourne on the Parade. Alan was also a verger at All Saints, Leamington, were he explored local history further. From 2001-2016, Alan was also the Leamington Town Council Mace Bearer, which prompted his mayoral regalia research.


He was passionately involved in Walton, Southam and Leamington local history, and helping to found both Southam Local History Society and the Leamington History Group. I can safely say that the LHG would not have come into being without Alan's commitment to saving, archiving and sharing his discoveries, as part of the History at Bath Place Project. We remember Alan with gratitude.

Alan tracked down and interviewed Czech Brigade settlers in the UK, using their testimony and photographs to produce a book. He was honoured by both the Czech and Slovak Governments for his tribute, and until ill-health prevented him, attended every annual Memorial Fountain ceremony in Jephson Gardens.

The Memorial stands as a tribute to the parachutists, and Alan, with his customary energy and attention to detail, set up a Friends Association to help fund its restoration, after years of Leamington's legendary 'hard' water had damaged it almost beyond repair.

#### **Town Hall Heritage Tours**



# Royal Leamington Spa Police: 200 Years (1825-1925)



A special 200-year anniversary celebration took place in the old Police Station in August 2025, with the present Chief Constable, Alex Franklin-Smith, in attendance.

An Act of Parliament in 1825 included the right to form a Police Force. This was based in High Street in Leamington's New Town Hall, and now the base of the Polish Community Centre.

It started small until 1839 when it amalgamated with the Coventry Force. However, things did not go well and in 1843, another Act of Parliament was passed, and the Leamington Police Force was reinstated.



The Force was also involved with the Fire Brigade and the Ambulance services. Various people stand out within the Police: Chief Inspector Edwards, who completed over 45 years; Chief Constable Thomas Taylor Earnshaw who completed 36 years and died in office; and Chief Constable Arthur Edwin Young who became the government Police Troubleshooter and served as the Commissioner of the City of London Police.

Due to the 1946 Police Act, Leamington lost its Police Force on 31st April 1947.

#### **Leamington Borough Police**



It became the Leamington Division of the Warwickshire Constabulary. Then it became a part of the Mid-Warwickshire Division. After that, it moved to Southern Police Area.

The Leamington Police Station is now housed in the Warwickshire Justice Centre, which was officially opened by Queen Elizabeth II, in 2011. This also has the Warwickshire Police, the Crown Prosecution, the HM Courts & Tribunal, Probation, Youth Justice, HM Coroner, Local Criminal Juvenile Board, Victim Support and Witness Services.


